An Air Conditioner's #1 Job – Part 2

In Part 1 | asked "What is an air conditioners #1 job?" The obvious answer is "to make cold air." But more precisely the job of an air conditioner is to make us comfortable. Making cold air is only the means to the end of the most important function of an air conditioner: to lower humidity. Here's why:

God made our bodies with a built-in way to cool us off: we sweat. When the air is dry – in low humidity - it acts like a sponge to absorb the perspiration from our skin. This makes us feel cooler and more comfortable. But when the humidity is high in summer, the air is

already so full of moisture that the 'sponge' is sopping wet and can't take any more water. Humid air can't absorb our sweat and so we're hot and sticky and uncomfortable. Cool air gives us relief from the heat, but if the air is cool and humid we feel cold and clammy. So to be comfortable we need Continued Page 2

cool air that is also dry. I have some important takeaways, but they are better understood with the knowledge of how an air conditioner removes humidity.

Very simply an air conditioner creates a cold surface for the humidity contained in the air to collect or condense on. This is no different than how moisture condenses on the outside of a pitcher of ice water on a humid day. The cold surface that is created by your air conditioner is in the part of the AC unit attached to your furnace. If you have ever wondered why it has a small drain pipe attached to it and possibly a pump - it is because it has to get rid of all the condensate collected.

From our example above, that pitcher of ice water will continue to collect water on it as long as the pitcher stays cold. The same thing is true for an air conditioner: it will continue to remove humidity as long as the air conditioner is running. But if it shuts off before all the humidity is out of the air we still feel uncomfortable. So the trick to making a house as comfortable as possible is to make sure the air conditioner runs long enough to remove all the excess humidity.

Here are the 'takeaways' I promised:

1. 'Bigger' is not 'better' when it comes to choosing an air conditioner. If your AC unit is too big for your house it will cool your house too fast and shut off before it does its job to remove all the humidity.

The remaining takeaways are the bad outcomes that can happen when this mistake is made.

2. Having a bigger AC unit than you need results in higher utility bills. Since a house with an oversized air conditioner will shut off before all the humidity is removed you will feel cooler but also uncomfortable. Thinking that the reason for the discomfort is that the house isn't cold enough, typically people will respond by turning down the thermostat. And while this does make the house colder it also increases the utility bill because the AC has to run longer than it should. And, unfortunately, doing this is what causes the air to feel cold and clammy. On the other hand, with a properly sized AC unit you feel more comfortable at higher thermostat settings which saves money by using less energy.

3. Having a bigger AC unit than you need can cause mold and other indoor air quality problems. Excess humidity will result in mold. And while people with allergies will be affected the most, everyone can be affected by poor air quality. Then there is the potential property damage caused by mold to consider.

There are other reasons that your air conditioner may not be giving you the comfort that you expect that don't have to do with it being the right size for the cooling load of your house. Next month we'll look at other factors that cause that and what can be done to fix the issues. But in the meantime, if you replace your air conditioner call us to make sure you get the correct one to remove humidity and keep you comfortable. - Dawiel Squires
