How to Protect Yourself From Drinking Hazardous 'Forever Chemicals' That Are In Our Water Supply

There is a growing awareness of the risks to our health from PFAS. called 'forever chemicals' that are in our water system. The Sunday edition of the Port Huron Times Herald on September 8 featured a large front-page cover story that explored the topic.

The article detailed a 'hidden threat' in our water supplies from "a class of harmful pollutants often referred to as 'forever chemicals' because of their indestructible nature." And that "You won't taste, smell or notice any change to the

color of your water if per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances, or PFAS, are present."

Two main sources of these chemicals are from fire-fighting foams and non-stick pans. I'm sure you've seen the non-stick surface on frying pans deteriorate over time and use, but if you're like me, you've never thought about where the flecks go after they peel off the pan. Now we know - they go into our water systems through our drains. But what we also didn't know is

that they are 'forever' – they don't break down naturally. And now they permanently pollute our water.

This poses a danger as there are serious health risks to us from drinking these chemicals. According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) "Exposure to PFAS has been linked to deadly cancers, impacts to the liver and heart, and immune and developmental damage to infants and children."

"Even in minuscule
quantities — a few parts per
trillion — long-term exposure to
PFAS can increase cholesterol
levels, damage the immune
system, cause cancers and
disrupt thyroid function, among
other ailments, according to the
U.S. Centers for Disease
Control and Prevention."

While the article focused on the danger of 'forever chemicals' in private well systems, people with water from public municipal water supplies have just as much risk. Per the Times Herald article the "risk of exposure for private well users is about the same, statistically speaking, as their public supply counterparts, according to a 2023 study published by the U.S. Geological Survey."

The difference is that the federal Safe Drinking Water Act requires public water systems to test and monitor for PFAS but there are no testing requirements for private water systems like wells.

Michigan is a hot spot for PFAS contamination. To view an interactive map visit:

Plug in your zip code and follow the prompts. If you do, you will also see the best recommendations for protecting your drinking water in your home.

The top choice is to install a reverse osmosis system at your kitchen sink to provide all of your drinking water. In

addition to the other cancercausing chemicals listed, reverse osmosis is able to eliminate up to 99% of PFAS.

What drives us to keep buying lottery tickets even though there's practically no chance of winning? In one episode of the TV medical drama "House", a patient was dealing with a diagnosis that had a particularly low chance of survival. They received advice that "statistics don't matter to the individual." And it's true. Whether it's the lottery, a medical issue, being struck by lightning, or any other rare event, what happens to 99 people does not matter if you are the 1 other person.

Some rare events inside of homes that come to mind are sewer backups and flooding. Even though most people will never have to deal with these problems, we see these every month. Even more extraordinary things can happen too. Back in May, while surfing the news I found an article about two natural gas explosions that happened within days of each other in Jackson, Mississippi. Two homes were destroyed, and one person lost their life. This article stood out to me because these unfortunate events could have been avoided. The local gas company had known about the gas leaks but had marked both as not needing immediate action. A quick Google search will reveal that, while few, there are residential gas accidents every year nationwide.

The situations that end in tragedy like those described above are extremely rare, but gas leaks in homes are not. Most of the time, they won't cause a catastrophe. But since the potential exists, a gas leak is still a risk factor worth taking time to carefully consider - especially in an older home. As homes age, the bathrooms and kitchens will be updated, the furnace and roof will be replaced, but the pipes can remain untouched for decades.

Many people assume that pipes will last forever. Actually, the gas, sewer, and water pipes in your home all have a finite number of years before they wear out. Depending on the material, the life expectancy can be anywhere from 50-80 years. But any number of factors such as poor installation, humidity, or even small manufacturing defects can accelerate deterioration in your pipes. If your home is over 30 years old, it would be wise to have the pipes checked periodically for wear and tear.
