How the Right Amount of Humidity is the Key to Creating a Healthy Zone in Your Home: Part 1: Reducing the Ability of Viruses to Spread

Controlling the humidity level in your home is potentially the easiest way to reduce a virus' ability to spread and infect people in your home according to the research data from multiple scientific studies over the last ten years.

In spring and winter, air is dryer and the (relative) humidity level

in many homes can be 30% or lower. Raising the humidity level in a home to 45% can make a dramatic difference by creating a Healthy Zone. Regarding flu viruses, higher humidity levels reduce the distance a flu virus will travel as it is contained in the water droplets that are expelled in a cough.

Even though the COVID-

19 virus is not your typical flu virus, its transmission method is through bodily fluids, and its ability to become airborne via droplets from coughs is very much like how the flu virus works. The same physics of why humidity reduces airborne transmission of a flu virus should apply to COVID-19

transmission as well.

The Science Behind Using Humidity to Reduce Virus Exposure

The research suggests that the reason higher humidity levels limit the ability of a virus to spread in an aerosol form has nothing to do with the virus itself—but rather the water droplets that carry the virus expelled by a cough. Here's why:

The distance the water droplets can travel when you cough is based on the size and thereby weight of the droplets. Smaller droplets of moisture are lighter and will travel farther than larger droplets which fall to the ground more quickly. This is because in dry air, much of the moisture in the virus-laden droplets immediately evaporates into the surrounding dry air. This reduces the size and weight of the

droplets thereby allowing them to stay airborne longer and carry the virus further.

The opposite is true with air in the 40% - 50% (relative) humidity range— the Healthy Zone. In this case, virus-laden droplets being expelled by a cough into the moister air can't shrink as much in size and weight. This is because the evaporation process described above slows down in air that is already saturated with moisture. (The wetter a sponge is, the less it can absorb water.)

The result: the droplets stay heavier and – along with the virus – don't travel as far and fall to the ground sooner. The bottom line: humid air decreases the “blast” radius of a sick person's cough, which lowers the risk of coming into contact with the virus. This is an

over simplistic explanation of one of the ways humidity affects airborne virus transmission. For the science, Google:

'high temperature and high humidity reduce the transmission of COVID-19' and 'dispersion of human exhaled droplets based on humidity'

If you don't already have one, you can get a digital, battery powered humidity meter for around \$10 - \$20. Then you can harness the above information to make certain the humidity in your home stays in the Healthy Zone. For more information see the nearby insert with a diagram that illustrates how important it is to stay in the humidity 'Healthy Zone'

called them 'Ebenezer Stones'. This refers to a story from First Samuel 7 in the Bible. The story relates how God miraculously delivered the Israelites from the combined forces of their enemies that had gathered to attack them.

As the Israelites looked at the army that was coming against them they were overwhelmed and afraid. Out of options, they asked the prophet Samuel to pray for God to rescue them out of their difficulty.

As Samuel prayed and made an offering to God, the enemy closed in on them, but the Lord 'thundered with such a loud thunder' against their enemies and threw the enemy into such a panic that the Israelites were able to rise up and defeat the enemy. Then from verse 12:

'Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen. He named it Ebenezer saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us."

Influenced by this story, in 1758

Robert Robertson, an English pastor, penned the verses of the hymn "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing". It has been a source of encouragement and comfort for over 250 years. You can hear this beautiful song on YouTube—search "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing with Lyrics Chris Rice." Let me share the words with you:

*Come, thou fount of every blessing,
tune my heart to sing thy grace;*

*Streams of mercy, never ceasing,
call for songs of loudest praise.*

*Teach me some melodious sonnet,
sung by flaming tongues above.*

*Praise the mount, I'm fixed upon it,
mount of thy redeeming love.*

Here I raise my Ebenezer;

here by thy great help I've come;

*and I hope, by thy good pleasure,
safely to arrive at home.*

*Jesus sought me when a stranger,
wandering from the fold of God;*

I shall see thy lovely face;*

how I'll sing thy sovereign grace;*
